RASG-PA's History

Latin America in Safety

- Between 2000-2010, the region had experienced tragic fatal accidents. Accident rate above world's average, and one of the world's highest rate of fatality risk
- 2008 the first RASG-PA meeting was held in Costa Rica
- **2010** PA-RAST hosted it's first meeting
- 2010 1st Pan American Safety Summit
- 2012 ALTA and IATA partnership to establish data sharing program
- 2013 partnership with US CAST to establish data sharing

Global Accident Rate (2019 – 2024)

2024: A Mixed Year for Safety

• **Global:** 71 accidents (个 from 50 in 2023)

Accident Rate: 2.56 accidents per million departures

+36.8 % vs 2023


• -12.8% from 2019

• Fatal Accidents: 10 (↑ from 1 2023)

• **Fatalities**: 296 (个 from 72 in 2023)

• **Serious Injuries:** 134 (↑ from 45 in 2023)


 Traffic: ~4.53 billion pax / 37 million flights – above 2019 passenger levels







Global Risk Composition


Fatal Accident and Serious Injuries Categories

Improving Our Visibility into Risk – Before It Becomes Harm

A Just Culture approach to support Safety Intelligence



Identifying Weak Signals Earlier to Prevent Accidents Across All Categories Strengthening Safety Intelligence Through Just Culture and Protected Voluntary Reporting

- **Serious outcomes** arise from both HRC and non HRC-domains
- Weak signals often begin as small deviations
- Just Culture creates the conditions
- Protected voluntary reporting provides the context and nuance
- Legal and confidentiality safeguards are essential
- Voluntary reporting becomes the system's early-warning layer

A Critical Gap in Pan America

Just Culture Based Voluntary Safety Reporting Program has Room to Grow

- Misunderstanding contribute to limited adoption
- **Grupo Aeromexico Safety Action Program** (GAMSAP)
- Potential gaps in regional safety intelligence
- **Expansion** of non-punitive voluntary reporting program is necessary






Pan America – An Opportunity

- Develop a Regional Implementation Guidance
- Conduct a Targeted ASAP Pilot within RASG-PA





RASG-PA's Non-Punitive Safety Reporting Strategy

Supporting Pan American States and industry in developing effective voluntary reporting frameworks

- Develop a RASG-PA Safety Advisory (RSA)
- **Refine** the Implementation Guidance Based on Pilot Results
- Promote Voluntary Reporting and Just Culture Across RASG-PA





RASG-PA's ASAP Pilot Project

Validating the Approach Before Wider Regional Adoption

- **Demonstrate** how voluntary, confidential reporting works in practice within RASG-PA.
- **Validate** legal, operational, and cultural feasibility before wider adoption.
- **Identify** what protections, processes, and training are necessary for trust and participation in the region.
- Generate early lessons and trend insights to inform regional Implementation Guidance and a future Safety Advisory.
- **Build a foundation** of experience that can be scaled across the region.





RASG-PA's ASAP Pilot Project — Overarching Goals

Linking frontline insights to operator, State and regional risk reduction strategies

Operator Level: Improving day-to-day visibility

State (CAA) Level: Supporting proactive oversight

Regional Level (RASG-PA): Enhancing collective

learning in the Pan-American region
