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

# **1. Introduction**

- ICAO is a UN Specialized Agency
- ICAO is established by the Convention on International Civil Aviation, signed at Chicago on 7 December 1944
- Universal application: 193 Member States
- Safe, orderly development of civil aviation
- 80th anniversary of the adoption of the Chicago Convention




#### **ICAO's Strategic Objectives**



# Enhance global civil aviation safety.



Increase the capacity and improve the efficiency of the global civil aviation system.



Enhance civil aviation security and facilitation.



Foster the development of a sound and economically-viable civil aviation system.



Minimize the adverse environmental effects of civil aviation activities.

#### **2. ICAO Policies in the Legal Field**



- Established in 1947 by the First Session of the ICAO Assembly and o pen to all Member States
- Main duties and functions:

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- to make recommendations on matters relating to public international air law
- to study problems relating to private air law affecting international civil aviation
- to prepare drafts of international air law treaties



# 3. The Work Programme of the Legal Committee

- 1) Review of the ICAO Rules for the Settlement of Differences;
- 2) International legal aspects of pilotless aircraft operations;
- 3) Implementation of Article 12 of the Chicago Convention;
- 4) Acts or offences of concern to the international aviation community, including cyber threats, that may not be adequately covered by existing air law instruments;
- 5) Promotion of the ratification of international air law instruments;
- 6) Study of international legal issues relating to global satellite systems and services supporting international air navigation services;
- 7) Consideration of guidance on conflicts of interest; and
- 8) Implementation of Article 21 of the Chicago Convention.

Templates for processing working papers and information papers are available on the Committee website at Legal Committee - 39th Session (icao.int). Any documentation received after that date will not be translated and will be issued in its original language only.

All participants, including observers, are strongly encouraged to pre-register online by 7 June 2024 at LC/39 - Registration. Passport identification and presentation of the registration confirmation email will be required to complete the final on-site registration process. Other practical information will be posted on the ICAO website mentioned above.



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


# Item 3 - Processes and procedures for States to fulfil their obligations under Art. 12 of the Chicago Convention

- Under Art. 12, the State of Registry is responsible for ensuring: that the aircraft <u>complies with the rules and regulations</u> relating to the flight and manoeuvre of aircraft in force wherever such aircraft may be; and the prosecution of all persons violating those rules and regulations.
- Establishment of the Article 12 Task Force in April 2021
  - Participation by experts from 18 States (Australia, Brazil, Canada, Colombia, China, Finland, France, Ghana, Greece, Jordan, Oman, Qatar, Republic of Korea, Russian Federation, Singapore, United Arab Emirates, United Kingdom and the United States) and 3 IOs (AFCAC, IATA and IFALPA).
- IFALPA).
  Key deliverable: to develop a process to use for the efficient notification and communication of alleged violations of regulations

#### **Progress made by the Article 12 Task Force**

- Establishment by the A12 TF of a Scoping Group (SSG) and a Tools Group (TSG)
- Issuance of a survey on the implementation of Article 12 by States





#### Item 4 - Acts or offences of concern to the international aviation community, including cyber threats, that may not be adequately covered by existing air law instruments

#### **Key tasks:**

- Secretariat monitored events and responded to inquiries relating to the MP2014 and the Manual on the Legal Aspects of Unruly and Disruptive Passengers (Doc 10117), with regard to their application to the implementation and enforcement of COVID-19 public health and safety measures on board aircraft
- A41-4, Appendix E contains model legislation on unruly and disruptive passengers
- 10-year anniversary of the adoption of MP2014
- CADOO Promotion of the Beijing 2010 instruments to address the application of provisions relating to cyber-attacks against civil aviation

#### **MEX Convention**

 Request by C 231/2 (March 2024) to task the LC to undertake an evaluation on potential solutions to amend the MEX Convention in order to redefine the role and functions of the IETC



#### Data protection and international carriage by air

- Joint ICAO-IATA Seminar held in September 2023
- Highlighted the complexity of existing national data protection laws as well as the importance of protecting personal data when transferred across jurisdictions



#### 4. Settlement of Disputes by the Council of ICAO

- Dispute settlement function entrusted to the Council under Article 84 of the Chicago Convention
- Consideration by the Council involves submission of written documents by the parties and oral hearings
- Proceedings are governed by the ICAO Rules for the Settlement of Differences
- A decision of the Council is appealable to the ICJ or an arbitral tribunal
- Recent cases:

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- Australia and the Netherlands and the Russian Federation (2022)
- Russian Federation and 37 Member States (2023)
- Canada, Sweden, Ukraine ant UK and Iran (2024)
